## What has been happening this week?

**Rights Respecting...**This week in assembly the children were reminded that our children's teams are continuing to be developed. The Rights Respecting team is now in place and they had their first meeting today. Miss Porter leads the Rights Respecting team and focused on understanding what the role involves, discussing some of the events that we want to think about for the year ahead. The children who are part of the team also support with assemblies throughout the year, charity events and sharing information with their classes.

This week our Year 6 classes visited the synagogue in Bromley. They explored an exhibition that is currently on display and had a guided tour of the Sanctuary with an opportunity to ask questions. # Attendance and Punctuality

We just want to remind all of our parents and carers that if your child is unwell and not coming to school that you must let us know. Please call the office on 0208 852 0852 and leave a message with your child's name, class and reason for absence.

Thank you for making sure your child is in school on time each day. If you arrive after 8:45, the gates will be locked and you will be asked to come and sign your child in at our school office with the reason for why they are late.

If your child's attendance goes below 92%, you will receive a letter from us in the first instance. We work closely with the Lewisham attendance team to ensure that children are in school at least 97% of the time.

## Online Safety Bulletin

### Being Unkind Online

It can be very easy online for children to behave in a way that they wouldn't if they were face to face with each other. Talk to your child about how they speak to others online and encourage them to talk to people online with respect and kindness, like they would if they were face-to-face.

How they act online should be how they behave on the school playground when they are following school rules. Here are some examples of what being unkind looks like online:

- Sending nasty or hurtful messages
- Leaving unkind comments
- Sharing photographs of somebody else without their permission
- Excluding somebody on purpose
- Impersonating somebody with a fake account
- Telling/sharing lies

The above might happen whilst your child is gaming online or whilst using social media or messaging apps e.g. WhatsApp.

### **What should I do if my child is being bullied online?**

Ensure that your child understands that if they receive unkind messages or see something that worries them, they should not reply or engage in conversation with the perpetrator. Instead, they should tell a trusted adult. You can use the tools within an app to report any offensive or hurtful content as well as block people so they cannot contact you again in the future.

## Brindishe Staff Training - PREVENT

Last Wednesday, as part of our safeguarding training, all staff across the Brindishe Federation (including premises, IT, admin, lunchtime playleaders and wrap around care) took part in some vital bi-annual training from Lewisham. The Lewisham Prevent programme is a borough-wide initiative between Lewisham, the police and other key agencies and communities to deter extremism and support vulnerable people.

### **What is Prevent?**

Prevent is part of the national counter-terrorism strategy and aims to stop people being drawn into or supporting terrorism. The strategy focuses on three key areas which are:

- respond to the ideological challenge of terrorism and the threat from those who promote it
- prevent people from being drawn into terrorism and ensure that they are given appropriate advice and support
- work with sectors and institutions where there are risks of radicalisation that we need to address.

## School Meals Spring Term Update Reminder

As you would have seen from our separate communication, we will be letting you and your child **CHOOSE their meal choice on a daily basis**. We are recruiting for a full time **Family Support Lead at Brindishe Green School**, a Lewisham Local Authority Primary School, starting on Monday 19th February 2024.

Brindishe Green is a community school where learning together is seen as a very important part of the education that we offer. We are a very friendly team, working in a highly supportive environment where individual differences are welcome and teamwork is highly valued. The school is arranged on three floors with our youngest children on the ground floor. Though the building might look traditional, we use it in a modern way. Each class uses their own classroom and a range of shared areas outside of this environment depending on the curriculum area or the type of learning in which they are involved. You might imagine this creates a lot of noise as children move around our large building. In fact it doesn't – Brindishe Green is a very quiet and calm school. Children learn in a calm and considerate way and behave responsibly.

At Brindishe Green we are looking for applicants who have experience of working with primary school aged children and their families. We are looking for a well-educated, flexible and confident person who is looking for a role in which they can make a real difference to the lives of our children and their families. Knowing our families and how best we can support is the key to making this role a success.

The post involves:

- Managing the school's Attendance and Welfare programme
- Providing pastoral support to pupils and families
- Supporting the development of pupil voice across the school
- Designated professional for Child Protection
- Being responsible for establishing inclusive practice in the school

We are looking for someone who:

- has experience of working with children and families in a school or educational setting
- can read and write fluently, have very good spelling and are confident in maths (at least GCSE or equivalent in maths and English)
- can demonstrate quiet initiative, self-confidence, common sense and maturity
- use IT confidently
