



What has been happening this week?



Collection: Please call and let us know if you are going to be late to collect your child.


Payments: Music payments are now live. Year Four Trip- please make your payment.




Black History Month



Rights Respecting Article Of The Week

Introducing Article 6 (life, survival and development)

Every child has the right to life. Governments must do all they can to ensure that children survive and develop to their full potential.



What are all the things that you need to survive and to develop?

- Good health – physical and mental
- Education
- Healthy food
- Clean water
- Somewhere safe to live
- People to look after you
- A name and an identity so you can be registered for healthcare and education
- Protection so you are safe from abuse and neglect
- A good standard of living
- Time and space to relax and play
- Knowledge of your rights



Article 6 talks about developing to your full potential and surviving; other words that are sometimes used are 'flourish' and 'thrive'. At home with your child, look up the definitions of these words – do they all mean the same thing?

Talking to younger children - It is never too early to start chatting to our children about how to stay safe online. But how can we do this? Here are some of our suggestions:

Use books to spark conversations
