Reception really enjoyed their local visit to the Library in Manor Park. We are so lucky to have this facility. Pay them a visit during the Easter break!


Year 1 were also out and about this week at the National Portrait Gallery. Year 2 made their art work from their portrait workshop into a beautiful display.

## Easter 2024 holiday activities and fun

Lewisham's programme of free activities for the Easter holidays is now open for booking. As before, they've teamed up with a range of local organisations to offer something for everyone – from sports and drama, to arts, crafts, and trips to exciting venues - see attached flyer from Lewisham.

You need to book your activity in advance. Places are allocated on first-come, first-served basis and are prioritised for children eligible for benefit related Free School Meals. Lewisham will also have a number of places available on a first come, first served basis for children who are experiencing hardship, but who do not receive Free School Meals.

#### How to book

Families who receive benefit related free school meals will receive a HAF Code via email or text message. This code will enable you to access a webpage with details of all activities and book your child's space. Please ensure you follow the link and instructions in the message. Please note each code is unique to each family. Families with more than one child will receive a code for each child.

If you haven't received a HAF code and your child receives benefit related free school meals, or if you require any support with bookings, contact <a href="mailto:HAFProgramme@lewisham.gov.uk">HAFProgramme@lewisham.gov.uk</a>.

Lewisham also have a number of places available on a first come, first serve basis for parents and carers who are experiencing hardship, but whose children do not receive Free School Meals. Email the team on the email address above if you'd like to apply for one of these places.


## Right Respecting Article Of The Week

### **Article 31 (leisure, play and culture)**

Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural activities.

### In what different ways have you enjoyed Article 31 with your children in 2024 so far?

- ·Arts and craft activities.
- ·Chilling out.
- ·Spending time with friends.
- ·Going to a museum or gallery.
- ·Going to the theatre, to concerts or to the cinema.
- ·Taking part in sport.
- ·Having a safe space to, relax, read, draw or listen to music.
- ·Playing at the park.
- ·Playing computer games.
- ·Doing yoga, meditation or mindfulness activities.
- ·Sleeping!



### What will you be doing with your children this Easter holiday?

Could you make an 'Article 31 chill-out den' in your home or garden where you can relax. Use cushions, blankets and even fairy lights.

Can you draw a sausage dog? How about a panda or a turtle? Take part in an <u>online art lesson</u> – which will you choose?

Some people like to relax by dancing. Different cultures have different traditional dances. Do you know any? Why not try to learn a traditional dance with your child using the programmes from <u>BBC School Radio</u>?

Lots of museums and galleries now have virtual tours so you can visit museums all over the world from your classroom or living room! Choose a museum and go on a virtual tour. Find out if your local museums or galleries have virtual tours.

All children have the right to play but many children with disabilities find that their local playgrounds aren't accessible. Watch this <u>video from Newsround</u> to learn more about this issue. Are your local playgrounds accessible for all children? If not, how can you help?

Relaxation is important and is a key part of Article 31, but sometimes we can find it tricky to relax, especially during stressful times. <u>Young Scot</u> has some helpful videos demonstrating techniques to support your mental health and wellbeing – why not give them a try?


