Online Safety message: The Dangers of Snapchat

Snapchat, among other social media platforms has continued to cause concerns around the online safety of children and young people. Unbeknown to some young people, sharing of indecent images of other children is a crime and could potentially fall within the follow four offences:

- 1. Making indecent images of children.
- 2. Possession with intent to distribute indecent images of children.
- 3. Distribution of indecent images of children.
- 4. Distribution of a private sexual image without consent to cause offence.

Legal Consequences

Children often don't realise that sexting a boyfriend or girlfriend is not a harmless act. Instead, they can face serious legal ramifications. Here are some important details regarding the legal consequences of sexting:

- Risk of receiving criminal charges for child pornography
- Risk of having to register as a sex offender
- Risk of exposing parents to legal consequences
- Risk of having to enter foster care or being removed from the home
