Dear parents, carers, staff, governors and friends,

As we are approaching the end of this first half term, many of you will be wondering, hoping and asking the same question...when will children be returning to school? As you will know by now, we will probably find out at exactly the same time you do, although on this occasion the government have stated that they will give schools 2 weeks' notice. Boris Johnson did state a few weeks ago that the earliest date would be March 8th. We will continue to offer the provision in school for critical workers and vulnerable children and to provide the online learning for those learning at home. We will be in touch as soon as we know when schools will re-open and what this will look like for children at Brindishe Manor, so please wait for us to contact you.

Along with other schools, both locally and nationally, we have now begun testing our staff in school, to enable us to detect any possible asymptomatic cases. Staff are currently testing twice weekly.

Can I take this opportunity to remind families that if you have booked a test for any person, you should not send your child/ren in to school until you have carried out the test and have your results, nor should you leave your home, other than to take the test.

Dyslexia information session for parents

On **Wednesday 3rd March** Theresa Kelly from the Lewisham Specialist Teacher team and our SENCO Jessica Dee will be hosting a Dyslexia Information session for Brindishe Manor parents. This will be a virtual session on Zoom from **3.30-4.30**. The session aims to give an introduction to Dyslexia, what it is, what are the signs that a child may have dyslexic difficulties and some strategies to support at home. It won't be possible to answer questions about individual children during the session, but there will be an opportunity to ask general questions. This session will be limited to 25 households, but if demand exceeds this we will run the session as many times as needed on alternative dates so that everyone who wants to, has the opportunity to attend.
