Dear parents, carers, governors, staff and friends,

A huge well done to all of the children this week for accessing, completing and uploading their learning on itslearning for their teachers to see and feedback on. The children in school have been doing the same learning with members of staff and have been working really hard too. I know that the teachers really do love seeing the learning and knowing how you are getting on. Miss Hockham, Ms Dougan and Mrs Guest have all been so impressed with the quality of learning and have been praising a few children from each class, each week, in their praise assemblies. They are only sorry that they can't get to everyone!

Many thanks to our Nursery parents who took the time to respond to the letter and Survey Monkey that they received earlier in the week, regarding children in Nursery returning to school. We will be in touch again next week with further information.

Live Interaction Sessions

From next week, we really hope your child will be able to join their class and teacher for their live interaction session/s. On your child's **Class page**, the teacher will attach a Zoom link that will allow you to access the session. Although the session is optional, we feel it is important that all children attend, and in some year groups the teacher will talk about the learning that the children will do over the coming week, or have done (reflections and feedback).

When your child attends their Zoom session, we must stress the importance of safeguarding them and others in the group. Therefore, please ensure that your child is ready for their session at least 5 minutes before it is due to begin and talk through with them the following safeguarding measures:

- the microphone is kept on mute throughout the session, unless the teacher turns it off
- the username is changed to the name of the child
- an adult should always be present in the room whilst the session takes place
- ensure that there is **no one else visible on screen** only the child and parent/carer (if necessary) should be visible
- turn off all background noise (TV, radio, music etc), in case the teacher asks your child to speak
- the session must not be recorded.

Year 3 and Year 5 Music Lessons

Year 3 and Year 5 parents and carers will now have collected their recorders or ukuleles for their online lessons, which will be uploaded onto their class pages for them to start at home. We would just like to thank the PSFA for funding the instruments, which are on loan to the children, and for supporting the cost of the lessons. If your child is in year 3 or year 5 and have been unable to collect your instrument, please let the school know and we can arrange for you to collect it.
