Dear parents, carers, staff, governors and friends,



This week our teachers have been busy meeting all of our parents and carers virtually! I know the staff have really enjoyed getting to speak to you all and being able to answer the questions that you had ready for them. Thank you for all of your positive feedback about the meetings. We know a few people have emailed us because they were unable to connect to the meeting with technical difficulties. Staff will be in touch with these families in due course if they have not managed to get to them already.

Closing bubbles due to Covid positive test results

As you will be aware, this week we have had to close two of our bubbles due to positive Covid tests within those bubbles. I wanted to just explain to all of our families how we are working within school to cover classes when we have staff absence (either due to bubble closure or illness) in this increasingly challenging time for all schools.

Each teacher has a set amount of time outside of the classroom to prepare, plan and assess the children's learning, which has always been in place. This year, Ms Cosin, Miss Hockham, Mrs Guest, Ms Dougan and I cover classes so that teachers can have this protected time. We try our very best to cover set classes each week and remain in designated bubbles. However, sometimes if teachers have had to go through Covid testing themselves, complete isolation or have ill health, we have no choice but to make further changes to our weekly timetable.

Every time we move any member of staff to another bubble, we record their movements on a central log, which means that should a bubble need to close, we can easily trace who has been where and therefore protect any other children and staff in any other bubbles by adding them to those who have to self-isolate.

I wanted to reassure you that we are doing all that we can to cause as little disruption to the children as possible, in what sometimes feels like a very challenging juggling act. We are making sure the children continue to have the outstanding teaching, the fabulous opportunities and exciting experiences that they have always had at Brindishe Manor. All of the staff would like to say a big thank you to all of our families for your continued support.

Winter performances

For many of our families who have been part of the Brindishe Manor community for a number



of years, you will know that our winter $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ performances are always a wonderful end to our Autumn term!
