#### **Introducing 'Sumdog' – an exciting new, evidence based, learning maths game**

We are delighted to introduce Sumdog – an exciting new way to encourage children to enjoy maths even more. Each child plays maths games and, as they play, the Sumdog automatically adjusts the difficulty level of the questions to challenge them. As learning objectives are achieved so are virtual rewards, including a virtual pet to look after and coins to spend in a virtual shop.

We'd like you to encourage your child to play a little Sumdog each week, if not each day! You can use the Sumdog website on your computer or

download the iPad or Android app. Parents / carers can even have their own free Sumdog log-in – just visit [www.sumdog.com](http://www.sumdog.com) and click the parents link at the bottom right. That way you can keep in touch with your child's effort and progress!

Class teachers will give you your child's personal log-in details as soon as you have completed our data sharing agreement. This agreement must be in place in order to set your child up on the Sumdog system. If you have not done so yet, please ask your child's class teacher.

## This week's learning at Brindishe Lee...
