This week's learning at Brindishe Lee...

This week, we did programming with BigTrak by pressing the number buttons. We also researched different houses like caveman caves!

Reception

We went to the Cutty Sark which was amazing. We're making posters to persuade people to go visit. We also made a pic collage identifying different parts of plants.

Year 1
Magnolia

We wrote non-fiction about the ginormous, beautiful Cutty Sark. We used phrases like 'On Tuesday', 'following that' and 'finally'. We also made figureheads there using felt, felt tips and wooden spoons.

Year 1
Sycamore

We did some fun drama this week! We dressed up as the bear from *The Bear*, *The Piano*, *The Dog and The Fiddle* and asked them questions we had prepared in our books.

Year 2

We've started doing a one-a-day English practice, so we look at a picture and write an exclamation or a rhyme. We also drew portraits and profiles of ourselves.

Year 3

We drew self-portraits by folding our paper to make guidelines: eyes are halfway up the face and the nose is a third of the way up. We're also writing stories similar to *The Selfish Giant*.

Year 4

On our first week back, we've rewritten *The Lost Thing* with a new, interesting ending, and have converted fractions into decimals in maths.

Year 5
Willow

This week, we looked at different kinds of drugs, how they can be good or bad and how to keep ourselves safe and healthy. We also started reading *The Tempest*.

Year 5
Cherry

We've written a newspaper report in columns about *PigHeartBoy*, discussing whether or not humans should have a pig's heart. We're also practising for our farewell performances...

Year 6

Our Sports Correspondent is delighted to report that Brindishe Lee came 3rd in a cricket tournament which had 16 teams in total. In fact, all three Brindishe schools topped the results table, coming first, second and third... it was a Brindishe domination! Well done to all those who took part!
