Dear families, governors, staff and friends,

It has been a really challenging week here in school, however, we have been humbled at the team spirit within school to keep the school open. A huge thank you to all the staff who have stepped up this week. Thank you also to all parents/carers who are keeping us updated about your child's health and the results of lateral flow and PCR tests. We would also like to thank Public Health England and the Local Authority for all their support and guidance.

Brindishe

As you know, we have many children currently isolating at home with covid. The symptoms have presented themselves differently for some over the past few weeks and have included stomach aches, vomiting, headaches and flu-like symptoms. We have sent a number of children home from school this week who are unwell and have these symptoms and who have later tested positive. We hope that all children and families at home make a speedy recovery and get back to school as soon as they are able to.

We also have many staff members who have covid and are isolating at home, which inevitably means that we are juggling our staff capacity every day. Your child may be taught by someone who is not their usual teacher, or have teaching assistants who are not familiar. We always explain to the children why this is and for how long this is likely to happen. The children will still be doing the learning that they would have be doing with their class teacher.

A few highlights this week at school include children discussing their learning targets and next steps. In addition to this, Year 6 have been discussing which Rights Respecting article they think is the most important. Year 5 have really enjoyed the book 'High Rise Mystery' as well as experimenting with figurative language. Other learning highlights across the school include exploring the Ancient Egyptians as well as exploring negative numbers.

COVID UPDATES: Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for COVID-19

As you know, from **Monday 17 January**, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace and the school office.

From **Thursday 27 January**, face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas for staff, but as there are a large number of cases in school (following Public Health advice), we will continue to recommend masks for staff and visitors until there is a downward trajectory of cases in school.
