COVID Update

From yesterday, Covid-19 restrictions have now been lifted. As we begin to return back to a sense of normality, as a Federation, we want to ensure that we continue to be as vigilant as possible, keeping everyone as safe as we can be.

In school, we will continue to keep classrooms well ventilated and focus on washing hands. The cleaning around school will carry on during the day and after school and we will be encouraging 'hands, face, space'. We are also beginning to review our risk assessments to accommodate and will update parents/carers of any changes as they occur.

We would like to remind you of the following guidance:

- If your child has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19 or a positive test result, Public Health advice remains unchanged which is to **stay at home** and **avoid contact with other people**.
- Anyone with any of the main COVID-19 symptoms should take a test and is advised to stay at home while waiting for the result.
- Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.
